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- 11-205 Penalty for Violation

11-201 DEFINITIONS. (a) The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and the enforcement of this chapter:

(i) Person. Any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, or organization of any kind.

(ii) Abandoned Vehicle. A machine propelled by power other than human power designed to travel along the ground by use of wheels, treads, runner, or slides and transport persons or property or pull machinery and shall include without limitation automobile, truck, trailer, motorcycle, tractor, buggy, and wagon, or any part thereof including but not limited to the following described conditions:

(aa) When any of the four tires of the main wheels of such vehicle have been removed or are deflated, other than for repair.

(bb) When any of the main wheels of the vehicle have been removed, other than for repair.

(cc) When such vehicle is totally or partially suspended above the ground by jacks, blocks or any other lifting devices, other than for repair.

(dd) When current license plates or valid temporary permits are not displayed on such vehicle; provided, that this shall not apply to vehicles in the possession of licensed dealers for the purpose of sale at the place licensed for such sale.

(ee) When any part of the mechanism of the vehicle has been removed so as to render the vehicle inoperable, other than for repair.

11-202 WRECKED, DAMAGED, DEMOLISHED, ABANDONED, AND DISABLED MOTOR VEHICLES DECLARED A NUISANCE. Any vehicle or part or portion thereof which is left or permitted to remain for any period of time exceeding thirty days upon any property, highway, street, or alley, which may become an attractive nuisance to children or accessible to children playing around, on, in or under, or where weeds, grass or other vegetation is allowed to grow in or around, or which impedes the cleaning of a public street or highway or the removal of snow or ice upon said street, highway or alley for a period of time exceeding thirty days, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, in that such vehicle or part or portion thereof creates a fire hazard, affords a nesting place or breeding place for mosquitoes, flies, rats, rodents, skunks or other vermin, is an attractive nuisance and constitutes a serious danger and threat to children and may be abated as such nuisance as hereinafter provided.

11-203 NOTICE. If the provisions of Section 11-202 are violated, the Chief of Police shall serve written notice, whether personally or by mail, upon the owner, occupant or person having charge of any such land adjacent to which the motor vehicle or a portion thereof is deposited, directing compliance with this chapter. The notice shall be in substantially the following form:

"To the owner, occupant, or person having charge of lands known as Lot _____, Block _____, Addition to the Town of Riverside, Carbon County, Wyoming: Notice is hereby given that an abandoned, junked, discarded and unregistered motor vehicle, or portion thereof, has been found deposited (upon the public streets, highways, or alleys on or near) the the above-described property in the Town of Riverside, Wyoming. This motor vehicle must be removed within five days from the date of this notice.

In the event of failure to comply with this notice on or before the expiration of said five *Days*

delivered agents, servants, officers and employees, will remove said motor vehicle. Any expense incurred by the Town of Riverside will be chargeable to you and will be collected as costs incurred in a prosecution for the violation of this offense.

11-204 DISPOSAL OF SAID MOTOR VEHICLES. Any abandoned, junked, discarded and unlicensed motor vehicle, as hereinbefore defined, shall be appraised by three disinterested residents of the Town, appointed by the Mayor, and if found to be under the value of \$25.00, may be disposed of in such manner as may be deemed expedient by the Mayor; and, if such abandoned, junked, discarded and unlicensed motor vehicle is found to be of a value in excess of \$25.00, the Town Clerk may, after giving ten days prior notice, as provided by law for publication and display of ordinances of the Town, proceed to sell all such abandoned motor vehicles at any public place, within the Town, between the hours of ten A.M. and four P.M. of the day appointed, and from the proceeds thereof, may pay the reasonable costs of such appraisal, notice and sale, together with 50 cents per day for every day such abandoned vehicle has been deposited upon any property, street, highway or alley within the town limits of the Town of Riverside, Carbon County, Wyoming. The residue of the proceeds of such property sold shall be paid over to the general fund of the Town, unless claimed by the owner, within one year from date of sale.

11-205 PENALTY. Any owner, occupant, lessee, agent, or tenant who shall neglect and refuse to remove said abandoned, junked discarded and unlicensed motor vehicle, as directed by this chapter, or who shall fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of the notice herein provided for, or who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter, or who shall resist or obstruct authorized agents, servants, officers or employees of the Town of Riverside in the removal of any motor vehicle, or portion thereof, shall upon conviction, be

be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$750.00 together with costs.

Chapter 3. Dangerous Buildings

11-301 Definitions

11-301 DEFINITIONS. The term "dangerous buildings" as used in this article is hereby defined to mean and include:

(a) any building, shed, fence, or other man-made structure which is dangerous to the public health because of its condition, and which may cause or aid in the spread of disease, or injury to the health of the occupants of it or neighboring structures;

(b) any building, shed, fence or other man-made structure which because of faulty construction, age, lack of proper repair or any other cause, is especially liable to fire and constitutes or creates a fire hazard;

(c) any building, shed, fence, or other man-made structure, which by reason of faulty construction or any other cause, is liable to cause injury or damage by collapsing or by a collapse or fall of any part of such structure;

(d) any building, shed, fence or other man-made structure, which because of its condition or because of lack of doors or windows is available to and frequented by malefactors or disorderly persons who are not lawful occupants of such structure.

Any such dangerous buildings in the Town is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

11-302 PROHIBITION. It shall be unlawful to maintain or permit the existence of any dangerous building in the Town; and it shall be unlawful for the owner, occupant or person in custody of any dangerous building to permit the same to remain in a dangerous condition, or to occupy such building or permit it to be occupied while it is or remains in a dangerous condition.

ORDINANCE NO: 151

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF THE UNIFORM ACT REGULATING TRAFFIC ON HIGHWAYS; PROVIDING FOR FILING OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT WITH THE TOWN CLERK; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE.

CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF UNIFORM ACT REGULATING TRAFFIC ON HIGHWAYS ADOPTED; FILING AND AVAILABILITY OF COPIES THEREOF. Sections 31-5-101 to 31-5-110, 31-5-112 to 31-5-232, 31-5-301 to 31-5-406, 31-5-503 to 31-5-960, 31-5-1101 to 31-5-1116, 31-5-1201 to 31-5-1214 of the Wyoming Statutes and all subsequent amendments thereto are hereby adopted by reference and are incorporated into this section as a part of this section as fully as if completely set out herein.

One copy of such provisions shall be kept on file in the office of the Town Clerk where it shall be available for inspection by the public during the normal office hours of the clerk.

ORDINANCE NO: 153

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR REGULATION OF VEHICLE SPEED WITHIN POSTED ZONES; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCE #148 OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE AND ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND DECLARING THERE TO BE AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE.

SPEED ZONES: It is unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle at a speed greater than that posted within any speed zone within the Town of Riverside. Appropriate speeds may be established for different times a day which times will be designated in such posting.
