ORDINANCE NO. 7A

September 7, 1908

THE ORDINANCE FIXING ALLOWANCE ON STREETS FOR SIDEWALKS AND PARKS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE.

Section 1. That the width of sidewalks be seven (7) feet.

Section 2. That the width of space facing the frontage and sides of property adjoining streets for sidewalks and parks shall be seven (7) feet for all properties facing or adjoining Riverside Avenue, and for all other properties facing or adjoining all other streets of the town shall be ten (10) feet.

ORDINANCE NO. 105

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REPAIR, RECONSTRUCTION AND REMOVAL OF ANY DRIVEWAY ON ANY WYOMING STATE HIGHWAY; PROVIDING FOR A PERMIT FOR SUCH CONSTRUCTION; PROVIDING SPECIFICATIONS WITH RESPECT OF SAID CONSTRUCTION; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF DRIVEWAYS AND ACCESSES; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE, WYOMING.

Section 1. Any access from a public roadway to private property hereafter provided, constructed, altered or repaired, shall be through driveways constructed according to the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 2. The word "street" as hereafter used is intended to include any street, alley or other public place within the Town of Riverside. The word "roadway" shall mean the paved, improved or proper driving portion of a street designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel. The sidewalk area shall mean that portion of the space lying between the street, roadway or curb line and the property line which is reserved for sidewalks, either existing or proposed. The term "change of use" shall mean any change of purpose for which any land, building or structure is occupied, maintained, arranged, designed or intended. The term "parking strip" shall mean the space between the street, roadway or curb line and the property line, with the exception of the sidewalk area. The word "driveway" shall mean any area, construction or facility between the roadway of a street and private property to provide access for vehicles from the roadway of a street to private property.

Section 3. No person, firm or corporation shall commence work on the construction, alteration, repair or removal of any driveway or the paving of any strip on any strip or street, alley or other public place in the Town of Riverside, Wyoming, without a written permit first having been obtained from the Town of Riverside and approved by the Wyoming State Highway Department in accordance with the current Rules and Regulations For Access Driveways to Wyoming State Highways.

Section 4. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO: 136

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING CARELESS DRIVING AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the Town of Riverside, Wyoming:

Section 1. No person shall operate or halt any vehicle in such manner as to indicate a careless or heedless disregard for the right or the safety of others, or in such a manner as to endanger, or be likely to endanger, any person or property.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to arrest, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00).

Section 3. Every conviction or forfeiture of bail of a person upon a charge of violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be recorded as an official action by the Police Judge and shall be reported by said Police Judge upon an abstract of the record to the Wyoming Motor Vehicle Division in the same manner as now provided by the Uniform Traffic Code of the State of Wyoming.

ORDINANCE NO. 177

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE TITLE 12, CHAPTER 123 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE, WYOMING, PROVIDING FOR THE OFFENSE OF CRIMINAL TRESPASS; MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO COMMIT CRIMINAL TRESPASS; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF RIVERSIDE, COUNTY OF CARBON, STATE OF WYOMING:

Title 12, Chapter 123 of the Code of Ordinance of the Town of Riverside is hereby adopted and enacted to read in its entirety as follows:

(a) A person is guilty of criminal trespass if he enters or remains on the land or premises of another person, knowing, or having reason to know, that he is not authorized to do so, or after being notified to depart or to not trespass. For purposes of this section, notice is adequate when given by:

(i) Personal communication to the person by the owner, the occupant, the agent of the owner or by peace officer; or

(ii) Posting of signs reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders which indicate that entry is prohibited or restricted.

(b) It is a violation of this section for any person to enter or remain upon any enclosed, fenced land owned, leased or controlled by the Town without lawful purpose and without the permission of the Town Council, Mayor or Town Clerk.

(c) Criminal trespass is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).
